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High School Completion Programs



New Britain Adult Education offers two **FREE** programs to earn a high school diploma. You will find more detailed information on our website

National External Diploma Program (NEDP)

The NEDP is a national, competency-based high school completion program geared toward adults who have extensive life experiences. It is ideal for those who cannot attend regularly scheduled classes due to job, family or other responsibilities. NEDP offers credit for work and life achievements, confidentiality, flexible hours and demonstration of knowledge and skills through real-life activities. NEDP candidates will demonstrate high school level abilities through a series of assessment tasks completed at home and during one-on-one meetings arranged at a convenient time with a trained NEDP assessor.

CT Virtual High School

The Connecticut Adult Virtual High School program provides students enrolled in New Britain's Adult Credit Diploma program the option of earning up to 7.5 credits online.

Courses Include: America at War, Geometry, Chemistry, American Government/Civics, Bridges, Math, Contemporary Literature, Modern Literature, Transitions, Contemporary Issues, Biology, Financial Literacy and Life Management.



Adult High School Credit Diploma Program (AHSCDP)

The AHSCDP Program is a way for students who withdraw from school to complete their high school education, by earning credits for specific core and elective courses. At the time of registration, students must present a signed parent withdrawal form and official transcript. Twenty (20) credits (4 English, 3 Mathematics, 3 Social Studies (American History & Civics required) 2 Science, 1 Vocational Ed/Arts and 7 Electives) are required to be eligible for this diploma. Credits may be transferred from previous high schools however, a minimum of 2 credits must be completed at New Britain Adult Education. Along with traditional classes, students may also earn credits through, online classes (CT Virtual High School), community service and work experience.

- Valid Photo ID
- Transcript from previous high school
- Immunization Records
- Withdrawal Form
- You must be at least 17 years old

Additional Classes Offered

English As a Second Language (ESL)

- Would you like to improve your English communication at home and on the job?
- Would you like to improve your reading and writing skills?

ESL classes are designed to help adults improve their English skills in listening, reading, and writing. Classes are offered for English Language Learners based upon the students speaking, reading and writing skills. Upon entering, students will take a listening and reading test to determine classroom placement. Classes are scheduled mornings at the Adult Education Office, Jefferson Elementary School, Smalley School and the YWCA. Evening classes are held at New Britain High School. **Please contact us at 860-229-6106 for a specific class schedule.**

Programy Nauczania dla Doroslych

General Education Development Preparation (GED)

The General Education Development (GED) program focuses on the development of reading, writing, mathematics, science, social studies, and technology skills in preparation for the GED exam. Students enrolled in the GED program can take periodic practice tests to assess their progress and readiness to take the GED exam. The exam is offered at various sites throughout the state and is administered by the State of Connecticut at monthly intervals. **New Britain Adult Education office is a registration site.**

Citizenship

This course is designed to help prepare students to pass the U.S. Citizenship interview and become American citizens. It also assists in improving English language skills while learning American history, civics and government. Students learn about the naturalization process and develop skills and strategies to pass the interview section of the Immigration and Naturalization Service test. The ability to understand and speak limited English is a requirement. Classes are provided free of charge to New Britain residents and will meet for six weeks at **New Britain High School on:**

Adult Basic Education (ABE)

Adult Basic Education (ABE) classes are offered to assist students in improving reading, writing, and mathematical skills. Many adults find they need to work on these basic skills for job training, employment, or as a first step toward earning a diploma. These classes are designed to assist students who wish to improve their basic skills and/or prepare for entry into the GED program or the Credit Diploma Program.
